Correction: Minnesota continues COVID-19 emergency declaration, though June 12, 2020; replaces expired stay in place through June 12, 2020 with limited community interaction; issues protections for vulnerable populations, workers; addresses conditions and requirements for limited reopening of certain businesses

NOTE: We previously stated incorrectly that the stay at home order was extended. The stay at home order under EO expired at 11:50 pm on May 17. Another provides for worker protection; another provides protection for at-risk populations and one discusses conditions pertaining to the limited reopening of certain businesses.

The Governor also announced a preliminary set of health indicators that could trigger a decision to re-impose restrictions to slow the spread of the virus which includes levels of COVID-19 testing.

[EO 20-53 - Continuation of Peacetime Emergency](#): extends peacetime emergency through June 12, 2020; See EO 20-56 regarding expiration of stay in place and expanded social interactions with limitations.

[EO 20-54 Protecting Workers from Unsafe Working Conditions and Retaliation During the COVID-19 Peacetime Emergency](#): provides protections to workers.

[EO 20-55 Protecting the Rights and Health of At-Risk Populations during the COVID-19 Peacetime Emergency](#): provides for protection of at-risk populations.

[EO 20-56 Safely Reopening Minnesota's Economy and Ensuring Safe Non-Work Activities during the COVID-19 Peacetime Emergency](#): limits gatherings other than commercial activities to no more than 10 people; requires a written detailed plan, social distancing and other requirements for businesses allowed to reopen.

[DEED Guidance on returning to work and limited business reopening](#): includes template for plan required for businesses allowed to reopen.
